Knit  Crochet  Design



Crochet Wrist Warmers

Materials

Use a super chunky yarn that has a knit tension of 8 sts and 12 rows over stocking stitch on 10mm (UK/Canada/Aus no.000, US no.15) needles.

Used here approx 180 g from a 200g ball of Fab Big.

Size

The length of the wrist warmer is approx 21 cm and the width is 25 cm all round

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Tension/Gauge

Using no 10 mm (N/15) hook, 6 trebles and 4 rows = 10 cm square.

Use larger or smaller hook if necessary to obtain correct tension.

Abbreviations

Ch—chain

Yrh—yarn round hook

Ss—slip stitch

Rep—repeat

Dc—double crochet

Rem—remaining

Tr—treble

Beg—beginning

Tc—turning ch

Tr dec—treble decrease thus: *yrh, insert hook into next st, yrh, draw through loop, yrh, draw through 2 loops, rep from * once more, yrh, draw through rem 3 loops on hook.

To Make

Using no 10 mm hook make a length of 14 ch.

1st row: 3ch. 1 tr in 4th ch from hook, 1 tr in each ch to end. (15 tr counting the first 3 ch as 1 tr)

2nd row: 3 ch (counts as 1st tr), skip 1st tr of row, 1 tr in each treble to end, working the last tr in 3rd of 3 tc. (15 tr counting the first 3 ch as 1 tr)

Rep 2nd row until there are 6 rows in all.

Next row: 3 ch (counts as 1st tr), skip 1st tr of row, 1 tr dec in next 2 sts, 1 tr in each treble to last 3 tr, 1 tr dec in next 2 sts, 1 tr worked in 3rd of 3 tc. (13 tr counting the first 3 ch as 1 tr)

Next row: 4 ch, (counts as 1st ss and 3 ch), skip 1st 2 tr, 1 ss in next tr, * 3 ch, skip next tr, 1 ss in next tr, rep from * to end. (6 x 3 ch loops)

Next row: (RS) 1 ch (counts as 1 ss), * 3 tr in next 3 ch loop, 1 ss in next ss, rep from to end, working last ss into 1 tc.

Fasten off.

Work 2nd glove to match.

To Make Up

Cut a length of yarn for sewing and unravel it. Using 1 strand only and working from the WS over sew the edges the 1st 4 rows of trebles, skip next 3 rows of treble and sew the side edges of the last 2 rows. Fasten off. Turn to outside and enjoy!
